

Course Overview in Details

INC 001 Why Israel? Israel's Prophetic Calling

The phrase 'a light to the nations' is a concept thrown round and about in every day Christian conversation, but what does it mean? How is related to the creation even and how is it built on by the Hebrew teachers and prophets beginning with Moses.

INC 002 God's Covenant with the Fathers

Who were these men that the God of heaven could make agreements that would endure not only generations but determine the destiny of the heavens and the earth.

INC 103 One New man

This phrase is used by Paul in Ephesians 2:15 but what its origins? How is it related to the oneness of God, the Shema, and creation of the first couple Adam and Eve? It explores how this idea is developed across the Hebrew Bible.

INC 004 The Bible, Israel and the Nations (Ruth)

This unit course explores Ruth and her enjoinder to the covenant of the fathers and the significant role nations play in the life of the nation. Is this a paradigm?

INC 005 Jerusalem (Zion): Past, Now and Future

Jerusalem is called 'the bride, the wife of the lamb.' This course unit begins with a course on the 'One New Man' and ends with 'Jerusalem as the Bride of the Lamb'. Jerusalem in the scripture is an enigma and this is what this course unity is meant to examine.

ILC 001 The Biblical Calendar and the Feasts of the LORD (Pilgrimage)

'God from the beginning of Creation envisions a live lived within specific confines of time and space.' This unit course explores the ordering of the day(s), week, month, the year and the years and its implications for our times.

ILC 002 Rabbinic Judaism/Second Temple Judaism and Jewish Life (Pilgrimage)

This unit course explores the work of the men of the Great assembly and their work in laying the foundations for the community of the future. Upon the foundations they lay emerged the Rabbinic movement which would later find expression in the New Testament.

ILC 003 Biblical Eschatology (The Past, the Present and the Future) - (Pilgrimage)

Eschatology is usually defined as the study of the last things, however in Jewish thought and life, eschatology is about what you are doing now in regard to the future. In other words, how am I shaping the future by my actions now? This course unit explores the Hebraic understanding of future in the light of the present.

ILC 004 Themes in Jewish Thought/life (Pilgrimage)

This unit course explores themes and concepts that define Jewish life experience and daily struggles. This include (and are not limited to) (Jewish marriage (bride, groom, betrothal and marriage); Exile (galut) and Aliyah (Return); Jubilee and Sukkot; Resurrection; Bread & Wine, The Temple, the Almond, Olive Tree among others.

HJC 001 Church History and the Jews

How have Christian leaders and the Church in particular related with the Jews through her history? This course explores this question beginning with the early church, through the Roman persecution to Constantine and to today.

HJC 002 Replacement Theology

The existence of Israel as a nation state is no longer relevant. This course unit explores the veracity of this statement and its implications.

HMI 001 Modern History of Land and People

How were the modern land of Israel and her people born. This course unity explores traces the establishment of modern land of Israel and her people beginning with the early emigrants.

HMI 002 Understanding the Middle East Conflict

The foundations of the Middle East conflict are rooted in **identity**. This unit course will explore the meaning and implication of this statement from a historical perspective.

HMI 003 The Start Up Nation – Innovation and Technology Hub

How did Israel succeed in turning a desolate and uninhabitable land and within a hostile environment surrounded by enemies into a thriving garden?
