

### Commissioning the graduating class.


Before we send our students across the stage (to receive their diplomas, degrees, masters), and then on out into the world, we traditionally worship together for one last time at a baccalaureate service.

The AIU Chapel, which also serves as a Multipurpose Hall, was initially roofed with asbestos material. This was not only a health hazard for the community, but also a critical compliance issue for the university with the relevant regulators including the Commission of University Education (CUE) and National Environmental Management Authority (NEMA). With the support of various stakeholders, the project was successfully completed before the resumption of university operations on 9th January 2023.
