A Guide for Using Online Resources and Services

Introduction

The Africa International University (AIU) Tony Wilmot Memorial Library offers a variety of resources and services accessible both on-campus and remotely. This guide is designed to help students, faculty, and staff make the most of the library's online tools to support their learning and research. It provides an overview of the library's e-resources, services, and how to access them conveniently from anywhere, at any time.

1. Accessing the Online Library

The first step in using the library's resources is accessing the library website. Both on-campus and remote students/users access AIU Library resources through the same online portal. Follow these steps to get started:

3. How to effectively search for AIU's Online resources

Accessing AIU's e-resources is simple and efficient with the right search techniques. Here are several ways you can explore and access our resources:

i) Through the Ebsco Discovery Service (EDS).

You can opt to use the EDS search bar to search across all 47+ databases in a **single search** including books, eBooks, journal articles, and more.



Advanced search

This allows you to quickly access a comprehensive range of resources, saving you time and ensuring you don't miss relevant materials.

ii) Search through individual databases

You can also search individual databases by accessing the A to z list of databases under 'Useful Links.' With approximately 47 databases available, you can choose the one that best suits your research needs."

iii) Online catalog (OPAC)

The online catalog, powered by the KOHA library system, allows you to search for print books and Kindle books. Please note that it is not designed for searching e-resources.

iv) Institutional repository

This is a digital archive or database that collects, preserves, and provides access to the scholarly works and intellectual outputs of AIU. It includes a collection of digital theses and dissertations, among other academic materials.

4. Login and authentication

To access the library's online resources, authentication is required. Use your AIU credentials (username and password) to log in. These credentials are the same as those used for your student portal login. This applies to EDS and the A-Z list of databases.



- *Whether on or off campus, access library can resources using the same login method.
- *As long as you're logged in, access remains the same regardless of location.
